



COVID-19 Closures and Service Adjustments

Phased Re-Start of Activities.

The City complies with the State's "[Safe Start Washington](#)" plan and Yakima Health District's public health orders. Yakima County will gradually re-open based on our progress against the pandemic:

Phase 1: High-risk residents should stay home except to get food or medical care. No social gatherings with people outside your household. Limited outdoor recreation, travel, and business activities are OK.

Modified Phase 1 (CURRENTLY IN EFFECT): The [Yakima Health District](#) has a specific roadmap for our Modified Phase 1. High-risk residents should stay home except to get food or medical care. Limited outdoor recreation and social gatherings with fewer than 5 people outside your household are OK. Limited retail, construction, barber/salon, fitness, winery/brewery, and restaurant services are OK. Open businesses must submit a safety plan and pledge form to the [Greater Yakima Chamber of Commerce](#) and post their safety plan at their front entrance for the public to view.

Phase 2: High-risk residents should still stay home except to get food or medical care. Social gatherings and outdoor recreation in groups fewer than 5 persons are OK. More business and construction activity is permitted.

Phase 3: High-risk residents should still stay home except to get food or medical care. Social gatherings and outdoor recreation in groups fewer than 50 persons are OK. More business activities involving groups may resume.

Phase 4: High-risk residents may resume public interactions. Social gatherings and outdoor recreation in groups of any size are OK. Activities involving large groups may resume (like nightclubs, stadiums, and concerts).

City Programs and Services that are CLOSED.

- The Community Center, the Senior Center, and all organized group recreation activities are closed through Phase 2 of the "Safe Start Washington" plan and will re-open with limitations in Phase 3.
- The Municipal Pool will stay closed for 2020. We will conduct some deferred facilities maintenance.
- The lobbies at City Hall, Planning, and the Law & Justice Center are closed through Phase 2. The Fire Department lobby was not staffed or generally open to the public before the pandemic.
- The Police Department will not offer in-person jail visitation hours through Phase 3. Online visits through Visitel are still available: <http://www.visitel.us>
- The Governor's Office has stated that a yard sale is a large "gathering" of people, which is not allowed until Phase 3. The City is not yet issuing permits for yard sales, and yard sales should not be occurring.

City Programs and Services that are OPEN or OPEN WITH CHANGES at this time.

- City Council is meeting remotely through Phase 2, and Council meetings are streamed online. Per Governor's Proclamation 20-28, no in-person component is permitted. In-person advisory Board and Commission meetings are also cancelled through Phase 2; some will meet remotely if feasible.
- The [State Supreme Court](#) has directed all Courts statewide to follow the most protective public health guidance applicable in their jurisdiction, and to use remote proceedings whenever appropriate. Civil jury trials have now resumed with certain restrictions. Sunnyside Municipal Court is using its drive-up Court window for certain cases.

- Essential City services are operating while observing public health protocols. This includes police and jail, fire and EMS, public works (water, sewer, streets, facilities), finance, and planning.
- Residents are instructed to conduct all regular business with the City by phone, online, or email.
- Please make all payments through Xpress pay online, by phone, or at our payment drop boxes. Payment by check, card, or money order is preferred. If you must pay by cash, no change will be provided, but you may ask for a receipt by mail.
- The City will not shut off or charge a late fee or reconnection fee for non-payment of City water or sewer utility services for the duration of Governor's Proclamation 20-23. Council has authorized the City Manager to temporarily extend administrative deadlines for payment of utility bills, license fees, and permit application fees, upon request due to hardship through September 30, 2020.
- City park grounds are open for activities like walking, cycling, or running in groups of five or less. However, park facilities like restrooms, sport courts, playground equipment, and shelters are closed until Phase 2. Residents are advised that the City does not have the resources to sanitize park facilities after each use. Park facilities will re-open with restrictions as permitted under Phase 2 or Phase 3.
- The recycling station at South 4th and Lincoln is open.
- The Airport is open. It is unstaffed; signs urge pilots and visitors to adhere to social distancing.

Mask Up to Open Up.

Per state and county health orders, residents must wear face masks at work, in all common areas indoors, and in public where you cannot keep 6 feet apart. Businesses must refuse entry or services to customers not wearing a face mask.
