**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, DECLARING
OWEN EQUIPMENT TO BE A SOLE SOURCE PROVIDER
AND WAIVING THE COMPETITIVE BIDDING REQUIREMENT
DUE TO SOLE SOURCE PURCHASE**

WHEREAS, the City of Sunnyside Public Works Department provides street cleaning services within the incorporated city limits; and

WHEREAS, the street sweeper purchased last year did not meet the needs of the city, and was declared surplus by council on June 25, 2012 by Resolution 2012-51. On October 2, 2012, the City of Kennewick approved the purchase of this surplus sweeper; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sunnyside has been in contact with the manufacturers from the previous bid process, and has determined that Owen Equipment Inc. is the only bidder to satisfy the needs of our Street Division to continue its street cleaning services; and

WHEREAS, RCW 39.04.280 provides that a local agency, by Resolution, may waive the competitive bidding requirement when the purchase is clearly and legitimately limited to a single source of supply based on further field inspections and specifications provided by previous bidders; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines it is appropriate to waive the competitive bidding requirements, and accept such bid and acquisition of such equipment from Owen Equipment Inc., would be in the best interests of the residents of the City of Sunnyside and will promote the general health, safety, and welfare.


**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, as follows:**

SECTION 1. The Interim City Manager is hereby authorized to sign the necessary contracts and/or agreements to procure one (1) appropriately

equipped used street sweeper, from Owen Equipment Inc. of Spokane WA. in the amount of \$210,634.02 including all applicable taxes.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall be effective upon passage, approval and signatures hereon in accordance with law.
