ORDINANCE 2011 - 22

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, ADOPTING CHAPTER 3.35
OF THE SUNNYSIDE MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING
TO AND CREATING THE FIRE STATION CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND**

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that the creation of a Fire Station Capital Projects Fund is necessary to provide an accounting for the construction and refurbishment of the City's Fire Station; and,

WHEREAS, in order to properly affirm the Fire Station Capital Projects Fund and to document its establishment, it is necessary to add Chapter 3.35 of the Sunnyside Municipal Code setting forth the purposes and regulations governing use of the Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that such amendment is in the best interests of residents of the City of Sunnyside and will promote the general health, safety and welfare; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council also finds and determines it is in the best interests of the City of Sunnyside that appropriation be created in the Fire Station Capital Projects Fund for the purposes of preliminary design and construction.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby adopted and established Chapter 3.35 of the Sunnyside Municipal Code.

Section 2. There is hereby adopted and established a new Section 3.35.010 of the Sunnyside Municipal Code, which reads as follows:

There is hereby created a fund which shall be known as the "Fire Station Capital Projects Fund." The fund shall include all revenues,

assessments, loans, grants or funds received for research, planning, development, professional services, acquiring and constructing a Fire Station for the City of Sunnyside. All disbursements for costs of planning, research, acquisition and construction of said Fire Station facilities shall be made from the Fire Station Capital Projects Fund.

Section 3. Except as amended herein, Title 3 of the Sunnyside Municipal Code shall remain unchanged.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be effective five days after passage, approval and publication as required by law.
