**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF
THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON,
AUTHORIZING THE COMMITMENT AND EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS
FROM THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA)**

WHEREAS, the City has received funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) that have been committed to programs including the following: Community Improvement, Health & Safety, Safe Community, Staffing for the Future, Utility Billing Assistance, and COVID Response to help mitigate the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on City of Sunnyside; and

WHEREAS, the City Council met on April 1, 2024 to review the program expenditures and make adjustments to the remaining available funds; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that changes to the committed funds within the established programs will promote the general health, safety and welfare of residents, and is in the best interest of the residents of the City of Sunnyside;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to purchase goods and services as described in Exhibit A with funds received through the American Rescue Plan Act.

SECTION 2. This Resolution shall be effective upon passage, approval and signatures hereon in accordance with law.
