**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON APPROVING
A PROCLAMATION FOR CESAR CHAVEZ DAY**

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez, a civil rights and labor leader, dedicated his life to fighting for the rights and well-being of farmworkers and laborers across the United States; and

WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez's unwavering commitment to social justice, equality, and nonviolence inspired people from all walks of life; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sunnyside recognizes the importance of honoring and remembering the legacy of Cesar Chavez which is the driving force of our economy and the heart of our community.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SUNNYSIDE, WASHINGTON, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City Council hereby approves a proclamation, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" proclaiming March 31, 2025 as Cesar Chavez Day in the City of Sunnyside.

SECTION 2. The City of Sunnyside encourages residents, businesses, and organizations to observe Cesar Chavez Day by engaging in community service, promoting education and awareness, and engaging in activities that promote social justice and equality.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is authorized to make the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, Resolution numbering, section/subsection numbering and any references thereto.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall be effective upon passage, approval and signatures hereon in accordance with law.

WHEREAS, César Estrada Chávez, born on March 31, 1927, dedicated his life to improving the treatment, pay, and working conditions for farm workers; and

WHEREAS, César Chávez co-founded the National Farm Workers Association, which later became the United Farm Workers (UFW), and his leadership was pivotal in the American labor movement; and

WHEREAS, Chávez's non-violent approach—emphasizing strikes, boycotts, marches, and fasts—changed the nature of labor activism and underscored the importance of community involvement in securing rights and respect for workers; and

WHEREAS, César Chávez's work transcended agricultural labor to advocate for environmental justice, women's rights, and nondiscrimination on the basis of race or nationality, making him a broader civil rights leader; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sunnyside, Washington, recognizes the importance of acknowledging the contributions of all individuals who have worked to promote justice and equality; and

WHEREAS, the principles of respect for others, service to the community, and social justice championed by César Chávez are reflective of the values we hold in Sunnyside as migrant farmworkers are the driving force of our economy and the heart of our community; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to honor the achievements and contributions of César Chávez to our community and our nation by designating March 31 as Cesar Chavez Day in the City of Sunnyside, Washington;


